PENN WRESTLERS DOWNED.

Princeton Wins Five Bouts Out of Seven, One Being a Draw.

PRINCETON, N. J., Feb. 16.—Princeton opened its wrestling season here to-night with an easy victory over Pennsylvania's grapplers. The score at the end of the meet was 5 to 1, and one bout resulted in a draw. The Pennsylvania team showed lack of experience, and although the Tiger wrestlers averaged lighter in weight than their opponents, they were quicker to take advantage of openings. The cleverest exhibition was the middleweight bout, in which A. T. Ormond threw Howard of Pennsylvania in 2 minutes 2 seconds by a bar and chancery hold. Capt. Ward of Princeton also gave a skillful performance. The heavyweight contest between McLean of Princeton and Burdick of Pennsylvania was declared a draw after two extra periods. Both men, although aggressive, were new to wrestling, and could not turn their hold to advantage. The summary:
