

# PRINCETON WRESTLERS WIN.

Columbia and Pennsylvania Tied in Intercollegiate Tournament.

PRINCETON, N. J., March 27.—The intercollegiate wrestling meet, which was stopped at midnight Saturday, was resumed here to-day, Princeton winning the championship by a margin of 6 points. The bouts Saturday night were long drawn out, and when midnight arrived there were two bouts unfinished. The managers of the tournament decided not to have any wrestling during Sunday hours, and the remaining bouts went over until this morning. The final score stands: Princeton, 17 points; Pennsylvania, 11; Columbia, 11, and Cornell, 10.

This morning Capt. Wells of Princeton defeated Nisson of Pennsylvania, on decision after one nine-minute period and two two-minute periods in the 175-pound class.

In the unlimited class Groff of Cornell won from Heilman of Pennsylvania after a twelve-minute bout, three three-minute bouts, and two of two minutes each.

## Zbyszko-Rogers Match Off.

The big international wrestling match between Zbyszko, the Polish champion, and Joe Rogers, the American Apollo, which was to have been decided last night in a local gymnasium, has been declared off for the present, as Rogers asked for more time in which to get in shape. The two special contests to precede the main event will be decided tonight, however, at Hurtig & Seamon's Music Hall, 125th Street, near Seventh Avenue. "Lex" Bersen, champion of the United States Navy, will appear against Eberhardt Holm of Harlem, and Neil Olsen, the Great Dane, will wrestle Jean Galvin, the Irish champion. Johnny Dunn will officiate as master of ceremonies.
