

PENN BEATS ORANGE FIVE.

Syracuse Meets First Defeat of Season by Score of 17 to 16.

SYRACUSE, N. Y., March 15.—The Syracuse University's basketball team suffered its first defeat of the season here tonight when the Penn five, champions of the Intercollegiate League this year, triumphed over the local band, 17 to 16, in the greatest game of basketball ever staged in the Archbold Gymnasium. Three thousand spectators were about the court, cheering the athletes every second. The foul shooting of Mike Sweeney won the game for the Quakers. He shot thirteen out of fifteen foul goals and with field goals by Stannard and Peck accumulated seventeen points.

Captain Schwarzer of Syracuse failed in his foul shooting, getting only five through the cage out of his thirteen trials. Every regular Syracuse player got a field goal. Paul, who took Schwarzer's place in the last two minutes of play, got one foul goal. The score at the end of the first half was 10 to 10.
