

PENN STATE WINS TEAM MAT TITLE

Scores Total of 24 Points in Finals of Intercollegiate Wrestling Championships.

PRINCETON, N. J., March 19.—Penn State won the team title in the intercollegiate wrestling championship here today. The Blue and White matmen were easily superior to the entrants of the other colleges and took three individual titles in addition to two seconds and a third. Yale, which was leading in the number of men qualified for the finals last night, could do no better than fourth, trailing Columbia and Princeton as well as the State team.

Captain Carpenter of Princeton won the unlimited championship with ease, throwing Mackey of Yale in the fast time of 1 minute and 14 seconds.

Columbia's only entrant to break into the point column was Hart, the metropolitan 135-pound champion, who won the title in this weight by the narrow margin of a 20 seconds' time advantage in two extra periods.

Another close final bout was that in the 145-pound championship, which went for two extra periods and was finally won by Morrison of Princeton. The Tiger had a 16-second advantage in time over Benjamin of Yale.

McBride of Cornell furnished the biggest surprise of the day when he threw Captain Ashly of Penn, the favorite in the 158-pound class. The Red and Blue leader injured his ankle in the bout and was unable to continue in the bouts for second place.

Lehigh was awarded the tournament in 1922.
