

PENN HOCKEY TEAM CONQUERS BULLDOG

Quakers Defeat Yale by Score of 4 to 2—Wanamaker's Playing a Feature.

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 16.—The Yale ice hockey team was defeated by the University of Pennsylvania in the Ice Palace here tonight by the score of 4 to 2. This is the first time in the history of the game that Penn has defeated Yale. Penn's cheering section went wild with joy as Percy Wanamaker, the former Dartmouth player, scored three of the four goals which gave his team a well-earned victory. Wanamaker's three goals scored in the third and final period were just about responsible for the game.

Penn outplayed the Yale team at many points. Their team work was the better and the players took the pluck away from the Yale players frequently. They shot their goals with a swift, unerring stroke.

Yale missed its great player Charlie O'Hearn, who was prevented from accompanying his team to this city because of illness.

The game proved a bit rough during the first period, when Referee Devine was forced to put a player from each team off the ice for tripping. First Reid of Yale was put off for tripping Wanamaker, then, a few minutes later, Captain Pringle was sent to the side lines for tripping a son of Ell.
