

OXFORD-CAMBRIDGE WINS AT LACROSSE

Britishers Return to Penn After Eighteen Years and Blank Quakers by 8-0.

PHILADELPHIA, April 7.—After a lapse of eighteen years the combined Oxford-Cambridge lacrosse team returned here and played the University of Pennsylvania on Franklin Field this afternoon, defeating the Americans by 8 to 0. On the last visit the British team was victorious by 7 to 1.

Frank Morley, the only Yankee on the English team, twisted his knee and had to be assisted from the field late in the game.

Skillful blocking by the visitors was the cause of Penn's downfall. The Quakers tallied one goal in the middle of the second period but it was disallowed.

On the soggy field, which was dotted with mud and water puddles, the British players took the lead in the first two minutes of play when Captain Hopkins, playing in home, got loose from the pack and tallied a goal. Just six minutes later Hopkins again evaded the Penn defense and spun the ball past Goal Tender Zisser for another point.

Although Penn forced matters for the next five minutes and had the ball in British territory most of the time, the defense of the visitors always tightened and in another minute the Britons swung the play from one end of the field to the other, Captain Hopkins for the third time getting loose and pocketing a beautiful goal. Before the end of the 25-minute half Pearson, Neylan and Wansborough each tallied.

Penn improved in the second half and it was six minutes after the start before the Britons were able to score. That honor went to Neylan. Six minutes later Wansborough made the eighth and final goal for Oxford-Cambridge.
