

# PENN NINE BEATS BROWN.

## Trumbower's Wildness Helps Quakers to 6 to 2 Victory.

PROVIDENCE, R. I., June 2.—The University of Pennsylvania, by a ninth-inning rally, defeated the Brown nine 6 to 2 here today. Trumbower, who had played right field all season, pitched for Brown. In the second inning he was wild, and with passes and two hits Penn put across two runs.

Up to the ninth Trumbower had allowed but three hits, and the score stood 2 to 1 in Penn's favor. In this inning, however, with three on bases Liebegott knocked out a long fly which Wolfe in left field misjudged. The ball rolled toward the fence, and Liebegott with three men ahead crossed the plate. Brown scored in the second and ninth.
