

PENN STATE TOPPLES PENN.

Defeats Red and Blue Wrestlers by
26 Points to 0.

STATE COLLEGE, Feb. 17.—Penn. State wrestlers were too strong for the University of Pennsylvania this afternoon, winning six bouts for a final score of 26 to 0. One bout was declared a draw after ten minutes of hard grappling.

Penn State won four bouts on falls and two on decisions. With the exception of the last two bouts all were evenly contested, and even two of the falls were not secured until the closing minute of the bout. Tom Ellwood won the quickest fall of the day in the 175-pound division, pinning his Red and Blue opponent's shoulders to the mat in less than two minutes.

125-Pound Class—Hunter, Penn State, threw Cubberly, Pennsylvania, with arm and head lock. Time—9:10.

135-Pound Class—Nallo, Penn State, won decision over Taylor, Pennsylvania. Time advantage—5:30.

145-Pound Class—Captain Evans, Penn State, threw Maxman, Pennsylvania, with combination body and head lock. Time—8:20.

158-Pound Class—Parthemore, Penn State, and Wight, Pennsylvania, wrestled to a draw.

175-Pound Class—Ellwood, Penn State, threw Lutz, Pennsylvania, with combination body and head lock. Time—1:55.

Heavyweight Class—Emory, Penn State, threw Kaufman, Pennsylvania, with half Nelson and body hold. Time—5:52.
