

DARTMOUTH FIVE BEATS PENN, 22-16

Tallies Six Points in Last Two Minutes and Takes Third Straight League Game.

HANOVER, N. H., Jan. 20.—Dartmouth defeated Pennsylvania in a sensational Eastern Intercollegiate Basketball League game here tonight that was not decided until the last two minutes of play. The final score was Dartmouth 22, Penn 16. This victory was the third straight for Dartmouth and enabled the Green quintet to keep the lead in the basketball race. Two field goals and two foul goals, with Picken and Friedman leading on the attack, were the points that brought victory to Dartmouth. At the end of the first half Dartmouth was leading by 14 to 9.

Going into the second half Penn opened up a powerful attack that was not checked until Penn had tied the count at 14 to 14. Close guarding kept the scoring down, and the next two points scored by each team were by fouls. The deadlock held until the closing two minutes, when the Green launched its winning attack. Picken was the individual star of the game, accounting for eight of Dartmouth's points, making two field goals and four foul goals.

Dey opened the game by scoring with a long goal from the field shortly after the contest got under way and he repeated shortly afterward. Near the end of the first half the score was 8 to 7 in favor of the Green, when Captain Goas's team spurted and reached the count of 14 to 9 when the half ended.

The game was hard played and much roughness followed, with the result that many penalties were called.

COLUMBIA ANNOUNCES WRESTLING SCHEDULE

Dates for Varsity Rifle Team and Freshman Five Also Are Made Public.

The schedules for Columbia's varsity wrestling and freshman basketball teams were announced yesterday by the Columbia University Athletic Association while the schedule of the Blue and White rifle team was made known by the Secretary of the National Rifle Association.

The feature of the wrestling schedule will be the intercollegiate meet in the Columbia gymnasium March 20 and 21. So far Columbia has won all three of its meets with City College, Brooklyn Poly and Syracuse. The next bout will be with Pennsylvania at Philadelphia on Feb. 14. Other outstanding matches will be with Harvard, Army, Cornell and Princeton. The only home meet will be with Cornell on March 7.

A game with the N. Y. U. yearlings on Feb. 5 opens the freshman basketball schedule. Following that the '28 five will face McBurney School, Cornell, Brooklyn Poly Prep, Horace Mann, Yale, Princeton and Rutgers.

A reorganization has been made in collegiate rifle circles with the elimination of the Northeastern League and the formation of the Eastern, New England and Middle States Leagues, all incorporated into the Intercollegiate Rifle Association. The Eastern League is made up of Columbia, Syracuse, Buffalo, Pennsylvania, N. Y. U., Penn State, C. C. N. Y. and Princeton. Norwich, winner of the Northeastern League championship last year; Boston, Vermont, Yale, Harvard, M. I. T., Dartmouth and Williams are the members of the New England League. The Middle States League is composed of Gettysburg, Johns Hopkins, Georgetown, Carnegie, Pittsburgh, George Washington, St. John's Academy and Lafayette.

The champions of the three leagues will compete for the Intercollegiate Rifle Association championship in the first or second week of April.
