

PENN AWAITS MAT OFENER.

Faces Brown at Providence Saturday—3 Heavyweights on Hand.

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 15.—The University of Pennsylvania wrestling team will open its season next Saturday with Brown at Providence. Donald Strohm, A. Kandell, a newcomer, and Charles E. Urban, football player last Fall, make up the heavyweight trio. Strohm now weighs 250, but Coach Bunny Servais plans to have him start the season around 240 pounds, the same as when he handled the heavyweight assignment on the varsity last year. Kandell weighs 210, and Urban 200.

In the 175-pound division Tom Pratt is showing the best form. Bill Buchanan looks the best of the 158-pounders, while Charles Martin, Phil Cronlund, Ray Taylor, Clifford Graves and R. Beam are waging a keen fight in the 145-pound division.

The 135-pound class will be taken care of by Captain George D. McDonald, a star in the 125-pound division a year ago. Johnny Bogden looks like the leading 125-pounder, but he will have to eliminate I. B. Smith of New York, Clifford Servais, Vroon and Patullo. Young Servais is a brother of the coach. In the 115-pound division Bill Fischer, Tony Macalucco and Stanley Harris are the leading contenders.
