

PENN STATE BOOTERS WIN.

Defeat Pennsylvania, 7 to 1, Marshall Scoring Three Goals.

STATE COLLEGE, Pa., Oct. 29.—

The Penn State soccer team easily defeated Pennsylvania here today, 7 goals to 1. It was the worst defeat Penn has suffered in recent years and is the second league victory for Penn State in the new Intercollegiate Soccer Association.

Penn State had a 4 to 0 advantage over the visitors at the end of the first half. Marshall was high scorer with three goals to his credit. A hard shot by Lazarus in the second half gave Penn its only goal.
