

PENN SOCCER TEAM WINS COLLEGE TITLE

Takes Association Honors by Beating Cornell, 8 to 1—Curley, Stars With Four Goals.

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 26.—Pennsylvania won the Intercollegiate Soccer Association championship today by defeating Cornell in the final game of the season on River Field, 8 to 1.

It was the first outright title for the Red and Blue since 1924. Penn won seven of its eight games this season, and tied Haverford, 1--1, in an overtime match.

Fred Curley, who was moved up to the varsity only two weeks ago, proved the star for Penn, with four goals, while Little contributed two. The Red and Blue led at half time, 4 to 1.
