

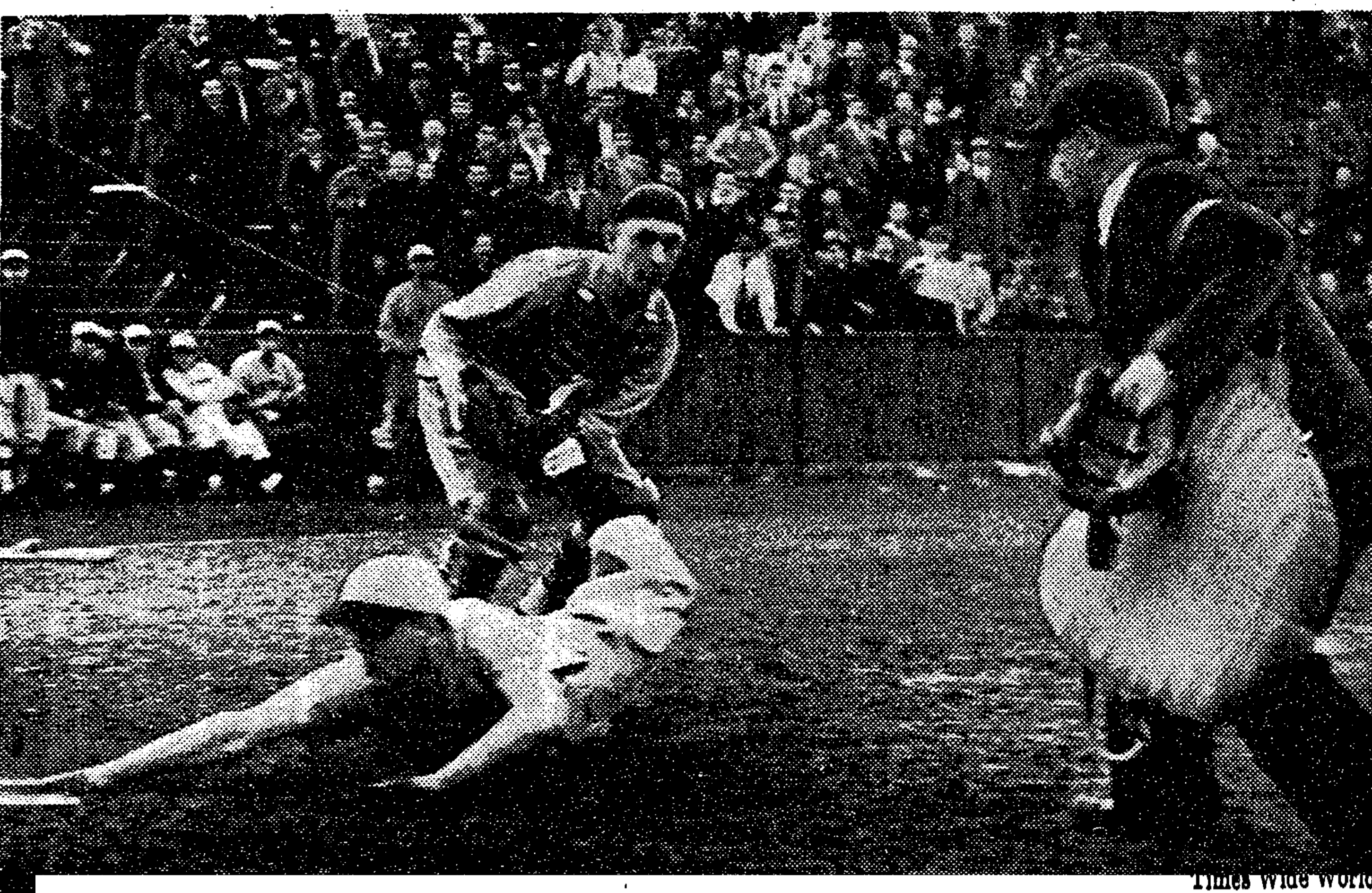
AT V II Beats Columbia With Three Runs in Sixth for Third Triumph in Row

Columbia supremely ruled roost for the major part of its ball game with N. Y. U. on latter's Ohio Field yesterday, suddenly, with two out in the fifth the home forces found their batt stride and proceeded to slam the way to a 4-to-0 triumph over Lions. It was N. Y. U.'s third victory in as many contests.

John Cerney, sophomore right-hander and a product of Flushing High, thoroughly tamed the Violet batters for four and two-thirds innings and set them back in order while his Columbia mates built up a 3-to-0 lead. He seemed invincible until Leo Tully faced him in the role of pinch hitter.

Tully was sent up to bat for Stan Rose with two gone in the fifth, and just as he did in the same role against St. John's on Wednesday, he came through with a single. His drive to short center convinced the N. Y. U. players that Cerney was faltering and they went to work on his offerings in efficient style thereafter.

One run in the fifth and three in the sixth, Alex Campanis's homer with one mate aboard, climaxing the latter drive, gave the Violet the victory in a game limited to seven innings by agreement.
