PHILADELPHIA, April 2—For the first time in history Drexel Tech defeated Pennsylvania in baseball today, triumphing 8 to 1, to open its season under Bill Haeffner, new head coach. The Red and Blue had previously taken twelve straight from the Dragons.

Hal Evans, veteran, and Sophomore Frank Carter allowed five hits, while Drexel bunched most of its ten hits with several misplays to score six runs off Ken Jamieson and Herb Rothermel in the first two innings.
