

Penn Crushes Dartmouth for Fifth League Basketball Victory in Nine Games

RED AND BLUE FIVE TRIUMPHS BY 64-43

Wettlaufer and Harman Help Penn Gain Early Lead Over Dartmouth and Hold It

SCORE AT HALF IS 28-18

Quakers Overpower Columbia Wrestlers by 28-5, but Lose to Army Swimmers, 49-26

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PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 26 — Showing superior ball control and shooting ability, Pennsylvania easily defeated Dartmouth in an Eastern Intercollegiate Basketball League game at the Palestra today, 64-43, before 2,000 spectators.

This was the fifth victory against four defeats in the Ivy League for the Red and Blue and Dartmouth's eighth setback in ten starts. Pennsylvania now has twelve victories and seven defeats for the entire season and the Indians thirteen and nine.

The Quakers solved the Hanoverians' zone defense early. Getting off to a 9-5 lead in the first five minutes, they made it 15-9 after ten minutes and then left the floor with a 28-18 advantage at half-time.

Jeffries Good Marksman

Because of the clever shooting of Harry Wettlaufer and substitute Hugh Jeffries, the Quakers piled up a 39-24 lead after five minutes of the second half. They were not extended the rest of the way.

Coach Howard Dallmar called on all of his substitutes in the last eight minutes. Charley Morrison and Paul Toth were outstanding among the alternates.

Scoring honors went to Wettlaufer with five field goals and three fouls for 13 points. Phil Harman, set shot artist, was runner-up with six double-deckers, four of them in the first half, for a total of 12 points. Among the starters, Herb Lyon and Bob Carlson were prime factors with 7 and 6 points, respectively.

Tom Rowe excelled for the Indians with three field goals and two fouls for 8 points. He was followed by Ed Leede and Jim Ballard who had 6 points apiece.

Runyon Averts Shut-Out

Aided by four falls, Pennsylvania defeated Columbia on the Palestra mats, 28 to 5. The Lions' lone winner was Bob Runyon, who got the decision over Bob Gilford in the 175-pound class.

Eric (Tiny) Larson, Penn's 290-pound wrestler, was held to a 1-1 draw by Bill Malone, who conceded 85 pounds. For the Red and Blue falls were gained by Dick Gotchel, 136 pounds; Captain Kent Haydock, 145; Sam Edgerton, 155 and George Hershey, 165.

Columbia's junior varsity also lost to the Penn jayvees, 28-10.

Army defeated Pennsylvania in an Eastern Intercollegiate Swimming League meet at Hutchinson Pool, 49 to 26, for its fifth victory in six starts.

Don de Forrest, in the 200-yard free-style, lowered his Pennsylvania record from 2:15.4 to 2:14.3. De Forrest also captured the 100-yard free-style for Penn in 0:52.6.

Cadet John Craigie won the 440-yard free-style in 5:02.4 and was second in the 220.
