

# PENN TURNS BACK SYRACUSE BY 71-67

Quakers' Drive in Last Five  
Minutes Decides Thriller—  
Villanova Wins, 66-64

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 13 (AP)—  
Pennsylvania turned back a sec-  
ond-half surge by Syracuse tonight  
for a 71—67 victory before a  
standing-room crowd of 8,707 in  
the Palestra.

Syracuse got away to an early  
lead, but Penn was ahead, 18—17,  
at the ten-minute mark. The  
Quakers then moved out to a  
42-32 half-time spread.

After the intermission the Orange  
fought back with Jack Kiley lead-  
ing the drive. With eight minutes  
gone in the second half, Syracuse  
caught Penn at 47,

Syracuse passed the winners at  
52—51 and the score was tied five  
times after that. Penn broke away,  
however, with five minutes to go,  
and applied the freeze in the wan-  
ing minutes.

Kiley topped the scoring with 29  
points on seven fouls and 11 field  
goals. Sophomore Ernie Beck led  
Penn with 24 on eight and eight.

Villanova staved off a game  
second-half bid to beat North  
Carolina State, 66—64, in the  
second game of the double-header.
