HANOVER, N. H., Feb. 10—Four quick baskets by Dick Kazmaier, Princeton football and basketball standout, ended a Dartmouth bid for its first Eastern League victory and enabled the Tigers to win, 66-58, over the Indians before a large alumni gymnasium winter carnival crowd.

Dartmouth jumped to an early lead when Kent Calhoun, Indian guard, sent the home forces off to a quick start on their bid for this carnival triumph. Calhoun, Bill Biggs and Dick O'Neill kept the Green in the lead until the waning minutes of the first half when Princeton's Captain, Mike Kearns, and Team-mate Dave Sisler combined to give the orange and black a 6-point edge at intermission, 25-29.

With Sisler and Center Foster Cooper hitting for the visitors, Princeton surged to a 9-point margin in the opening minutes of the second half. Then Biggs rallied the big Green, which held the visitors scoreless for almost five minutes.

Tritschler Scores Basket

With the Tigers leading, 40-34, Calhoun and Biggs narrowed it to 40-37, but Fred Tritschler scored to keep the Tigers 6 points ahead. Biggs dropped in two one-handed shots to pull the Green within 2 points, but Charles Devoe of Princeton scored on a set.

With seven minutes remaining, Biggs paced the Dartmouth five to a tie and then to a 52-48 lead.

Sisler put the visitors into a tie at 52-all with two baskets, then Kazmaier took over. In the final five minutes, with Calhoun, and Rog Pierce, two Indian regulars, out on fouls, the Tigers pulled ahead.

Biggs led the Green with 19 points. Tritschler garnered 14 for the winners.

Harvard Rally Fails

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 10 (AP)—Pennsylvania checked a last-ditch Harvard rally tonight to eke out a 66-64 victory in an Eastern League basketball game at the Palestra. It was the fifth league victory in eight starts for Penn and Harvard's third loss in four tries.

In the second game Toledo stunned the nation's ninth ranking team, Villanova, with a 62-to-57 setback before 5,123. It was only Villanova's second defeat in twenty games.

Penn took a 37-to-32 halftime lead after the score had been tied fourteen times in the opening 20 minutes. Sophomore Ernie Beck paced the winners with 23 points. Beck, E. I. L., scoring leader, dropped nine of fifteen shots and added five fouls.

Jim Gabler registered 21 points for Harvard as the Crimson made twenty-four field goals on eighty attempts. Penn, using only six men in the game, netted twenty-five baskets on only fifty-eight shots in beating Harvard for the second time this season and raising its season's total to thirteen triumphs in nineteen games.
