

YALE QUINTET STOPS PENN IN 91-64 UPSET

Beck of Quakers Sets League Season Mark of 261 Points, but Princeton Nears Title

NEW HAVEN, Conn., March 11 — Yale's unpredictable basketball forces salvaged some balm from a disappointing campaign by upsetting Pennsylvania tonight, 91-64, in an Eastern Intercollegiate League clash.

Although he was limited to only 11 points before he fouled out after thirty-five seconds of fourth-quarter action, Ernie Beck of the Quakers shattered the league season scoring record of 256 points established by Tony Lavelli of Yale in 1949.

Beck, who entered the game with 250 points, tied with a jump shot at 9:30 of the first period and tallied No. 257 2 minutes and 15 seconds later. His total is now 261.

The setback by a team the Quakers had overwhelmed, 81-55, in the opening league game at Philadelphia, virtually eliminated the Red and Blue from title contention. Penn is now tied for second place with Cornell.

The upset assured Princeton of at least a tie for the title. Leading with a 9-1 record as against 8-3 for Penn and Cornell, the Tigers can clinch the title by beating either Columbia tomorrow night or Penn on Saturday.

Spence Schnaitter, sophomore center, and Johnny Weber, junior forward, paced the Eli troupe with 24 and 21 points, respectively.

Tom Holt tallied 13 points to take scoring honors for the losers.

The Elis broke sharply, but, after taking early command at 5-0 and 8-2, permitted Pennsylvania to edge to the front, 18-17, at 7:31 of the opening period.

The Quakers later led on two occasions by a single point before Weber's hook shot returned the Elis to the fore at 23-22 at the end of the first quarter. They were never headed thereafter.

In front by 45-31 at the half, the Bulldogs subsequently increased their margin to 27 points.
