

PENN STATE TAKES 2D STRAIGHT TITLE

Scores 33 Points in Eastern
Wrestling—Nittany Lions'
Lemyre Brothers Win

BETHLEHEM, Pa., March 15—Penn State College won its second Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Association team championship in a row by crowning three individual champions and scoring 33 points tonight. Syracuse finished second with no champions but 17 points.

The Nittany Lions' victory marked the first time since 1942 that Coach Charlie Speidel's matmen had walked off with three individual titles.

It also marked the first time since 1908 that a brother combination won titles under the banner of the same institution. Tonight, Penn State's Lemyre Brothers from Merrick, L. I., captured honors.

Dick scored a 10—9 verdict over Lehigh's Ken Faust in the 130-pound class. Joe triumphed over Ray Vohden of Rutgers by a pin in the 167-pound division.

The only other brother combination to win titles in the same tourney represented Yale forty-four years ago. George Dole took the 145-pound class that year and his brother, Lou, triumphed in the 125-pound division.

Other team scores were: Rutgers 16; Lehigh 15; Army and Columbia, 12 each; Princeton 10; Yale 8; Cornell 7; Brown and Navy, 6 each; Harvard 3; Frank-

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lin and Marshall and Temple, 2 each; Virginia 1.

Ralph G. Anderton of Brown was elected president of the Eastern Collegiate Wrestling Coaches Association at a business meeting.

Other officers named were Karl Kitt, Navy, vice president, and Frank W. Finger, Virginia, secretary-treasurer.

The coaches selected Lehigh University as the site of the officials' annual clinic on Nov. 29. Princeton will be the scene of the 1953 title bouts on March 12 and 13.
