

Penn Opens 53d Basketball Season by Beating Maryland

QUAKERS REGISTER 70-TO-53 TRIUMPH

Penn Victor Despite Schue's
26 Markers for Maryland
in Palestra Contest

CORNELL FIVE WINS, 75-42

Uses Two Separate Teams in
Defeating Alfred—Morton
Stars With 19 Points

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 6 (AP)—
Penn's basketball team opened its
fifty-third basketball campaign to-
night by downing Maryland, 70-
53, despite a 26-point effort by
Forward Gene Shue for the Ter-
rapins at the Palestra.

The Quakers, led by Ernie Beck,
took the lead in the opening min-
ute of play and stayed in front
the rest of the way. In the final
period, the Quakers poured in 25
points to seal the verdict against
the tiring Terrapins.

Beck led the Quaker scoring
with 24 points, but Shue dominated
the action in the contest and kept
the Terrapins as close as they
stayed before the 4,550 fans.

Maryland's 6-foot 4-inch center,
Morris Levin, battled Beck under
the boards throughout the game
and added 11 points to the Terps'
total. Beck, the nation's leading
college rebounder two years ago,
captured eighteen.
