PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 10 (AP)—Penn's 6-4 center, Ernie Beck, poured 25 points through the hoops tonight as the Quakers evened their Ivy League record at 1-1 by defeating Yale, 63-51, before 5,329 fans at the Palestra.

Bob Schaffer, Villanova's sharp-shooting forward scored 33 points to lead his team to a 94-86 victory over Xavier of Ohio in the second game.

Schaffer, reportedly kidnapped Tuesday night by four men and told to "be less active" in future Villanova games, was sensational from the opening jump as he totaled fifteen field goals in thirty-one shots. Schaeffer's goal production left him one short of the Palestra individual field goal record set by Penn's Beck against Dartmouth two years ago.

Penn, loser to Yale in New Haven earlier this week, switched from its usual man-to-man defense to a sliding zone against the Bulldogs and held the visitors to three field goals in 42 shots during the first half.

Yale's 6 foot 7 inch center, Shep Smith, connected with a short jump shot as the second quarter began to bring the Eli to within one point of a tie. The Bulldogs threw twenty shots at the basket in the last nine minutes of the quarter but failed to sink one.

Beck and Dick Heylmun combined to move the Quakers to a 25-15 half-time lead.

Beck and Heylmun scored seven of the eight second half quarter field goals as Penn protected its margin. Yale captain John Weber brought his club to within five points of a tie midway in the third period, but Beck and Bart Leach sent the third quarter margin to nine points.

Heylmun followed Beck in the scoring column for Penn with 16 points. Jerry Labriola led Yale with 11. Weber netted 10 points in a losing cause.

Beck's 25 points brought his season's total to 258 in nine games, a 28.7 average.
