

# Navy Upsets Penn on Clune's Basket in Last Second at Annapolis

## COLGATE CONQUERS ARMY

Red Raiders Triumph, 76-74,  
as Dodd Collects 28 Points

ANNAPOLIS, Md., Feb. 11—A field goal by John Clune with just one second left broke a six-game Pennsylvania winning streak as Navy's middies upset the Quakers today, 62—60.

With the score knotted at 60—all and seconds remaining, Ed Hogan intercepted a Penn pass directed at Ernie Beck and tossed the ball to Clune, who went in for the game-winning lay-up. The Pennsylvanians had been playing possession ball for the previous ninety seconds, as they attempted to work the ball to Beck for a single goal attempt before the final gun.

### Lange Held to 12 Points

Clune's basket gave him 20 points, tops for the middies. Beck was the game's scoring leader with 31. Don Lange, Navy's leading point collector for the year, was held to 12.

The battle was a sizzler all the way. The score was deadlocked sixteen times and the lead changed hands thirteen. Navy's 8-point margin after two minutes of the final quarter was the game's biggest point spread.

The victory was Navy's thirteenth in sixteen starts. Pennsylvania, the Ivy League leader, also has won thirteen and lost three games.
