

ST. JOSEPH'S BEATS MANHATTAN, 82-76

Hawks' Five Loses 16-Point Lead Before Rally—Penn Tops Princeton, 67-57

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 2 — St. Joseph's College, after losing a 16-point first-half lead, defeated Manhattan College, 82—76, tonight in the second game of a basketball double-header at the Palestra.

The University of Pennsylvania, behind a 29-point performance by Bob Mlkvy, beat Princeton, 67—57, in the first game. It was the season opener in the Ivy League for both teams.

St. Joseph's had a 22-6 lead over Manhattan eight minutes after their game had started. Then the Jaspers came to life, cutting the lead to 36—32 at half-time. Manhattan continued to press in the second half and tied the game at 57-all on two consecutive lay-ups by Joe Dougherty.

Finally, St. Joseph's John Egan sank two free throws to send the Hawks into a 71-70 lead. They widened this margin until the game ended.

Egan was high scorer with

24 points, 22 in the second half. Dougherty led Manhattan with 17.

Penn opened a 10-4 lead over Princeton in the first five minutes of play and held a 24-18 lead with three minutes left in the first half. But field goals by Al Kaemmerlen, Pete Campbell and Don Swan tied the score at 24-24 at half-time.

The second half was nip and tuck until the Quakers' Joe Cook registered with a field goal and two free throws. That sent Penn in front 41-38. In the last thirteen minutes of play the Quakers steadily widened the lead.

Campbell scored 21 points, tops for the Tigers and second to Mlkvy in the game.
