

Villanova Sets Back Iowa, 69-56, in Final of Quaker City Tournament

DUQUESNE BEATS PENN FIVE, 88-67

Dukes Take Third Place in Tournament—Holy Cross and Niagara Also Win

PHILADELPHIA, Dec. 30 (AP)—Unbeaten Villanova stole Iowa passes and turned them into field goals tonight for a 69-56 victory in the final of the Quaker City basketball tournament.

The unranked Wildcats extended their winning streak this season to eleven games, the longest in the nation. On the way to the final, Villanova beat Niagara and nationally ranked Duquesne.

Hubie White, George Leftwich and Wally Jones led the Wildcats. Leftwich scored 18 points and White 17.

Jones, voted the tournament's outstanding player, contributed 11 points. But his ballhawking, rebounding and passing highlighted the Villanova attack.

Somerset Leads Duquesne

Duquesne took third place by beating Penn, 88-67. Willie Somerset and Paul Benec sparked the Dukes. Somerset posted 33 points and Benec 26. Sid Amira of Penn sank a 60-foot field goal—the longest shot ever recorded at the Palestra.

Holy Cross, paced by Jack Foley, trounced Wyoming, 83-69, for fifth place. Foley registered 30 points. He also lifted his string of consecutive foul shots in the tournament to thirty-four before missing one after six tries.

In a game for seventh place, Ken Glenn registered 33 points, 9 of them in a five-minute overtime period, and led Niagara to a 77-70 triumph over Penn State.
