

# YALE FIVE'S RALLY BEATS PENN, 67-63

## Elis Keep Ivy League Lead With Fourth in Row

NEW HAVEN, Jan. 13 —

Yale's basketball team remained in first place in the Ivy League tonight by beating Pennsylvania, 67—63.

The lead switched ten times in the first half, which ended with the visitors ahead by 30—27.

Yale took a 10-point advantage late in the second half. The Elis, with four sophomores joining a senior, Bill Madden, in the line-up, then held off a Penn rally.

Yale is now 8—4 over all and 4—0 in the Ivy League. Pennsylvania is 7—4 over all and 2—1 in Ivy play.

## Cornell Tops Harvard, 82-75

Cornell basketball team staved off an early second-half surge and beat Harvard, 82—75, tonight. The Big Red, extending its unbeaten streak in the Ivy League to three games, led by as many as 15 points in the first half.

Harvard cut the lead to 3 points five minutes after the teams returned to the floor as its captain, Gary Borchard, led the Crimson attack. Borchard finished with the game's scoring honors at 22 points.

Jerry Krumbein, a 6-foot-6-inch junior, and Gerry Szachara, Cornell's star backcourt man, were the high scorers for the Big Red with 20 and 19 points, respectively. Cornell's over-all won-lost record is now 10—2. Harvard is 8—5 for the season, 1—2 in Ivy League play.
