

Yale and Cornell Basketball Teams Triumph and Remain Tied for Ivy Lead

DARTMOUTH BOWS TO ELIS, 85 TO 72

Yale Wins Despite Spahn's 27 Points—Penn Beaten at Ithaca, 60 to 50

HANOVER, N. H., Feb. 10 —Steve Spahn of Dartmouth scored 27 points tonight but Yale downed the Indians, 85-72, before 1,400 fans at Alumni Gymnasium.

Spahn hit 13 for 13 at the foul line and collected seven field goals.
The Elis had five men in double figures, led by Capt. Bill Madden, who scored 18. They capitalized on a driving offense to gain their seventh Ivy victory in eight contests and maintain their league lead. They have a 12-5 won-lost record over all.

The Indians' Ivy record is 3-5 and 6-12 over all.
Cornell also won tonight and stayed tied for the league lead with Yale.

The outcome was in doubt until the last four minutes. With the score 41-41, the Big Red, which had never led by more than 4 points, scored nine straight. The Pennsylvania defense collapsed after Bob Purdy and Joe Andrews had gone out on fouls.

For the second consecutive night the Cornell attack was paced by a senior forward and acting captain, Bill Baugh. He was the game's high scorer with 18 points. The Big Red's backcourt star, Gerry Szachara, finished with 16 points.

Ray Carazo had 13 points for Pennsylvania. Cornell's Ivy won-and-lost record is 7-1, over-all 16-13, Penn is 11-7, with 5-3 in the League.
