

St. Joseph's Rally Tops N.Y.U., 82-76

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 4
—St. Joseph's of Philadelphia, paced by Steve Courtin's 22 points, rallied in the closing minutes tonight to defeat New York University, 82—76, in the opening game of a basketball double-header at the Palestra.

La Salle defeated Penn, 61—58.

The St. Joseph's-N.Y.U. game was tied eight times, the last at 70. At this point Courtin dribbled the length of the court to score on a layup with 2:22 left in the game to give St. Joseph's the lead it held till the end.

Courtin scored seven points in the final two minutes and 22 seconds, four on free throws.

All St. Joseph's starters scored in double figures. Jim Boyle was runner-up to Courtin with 18.

Harold Hairston had 28 points to pace N.Y.U. and Barry Kramer had 25.
