

Cornell Triumphs Over Penn, 85-70

ITHACA, N. Y., Jan. 18—Cornell, with a strong second-half effort, handed Pennsylvania its first Ivy League basketball defeat of the season, 85—70, tonight. The victory gave the Big Red a 4-1 won-lost league mark. Penn has a 3-1 record.

Leading by only 39—35 at half time, Cornell dominated the first 15 minutes of the second half to carve a 78-53 advantage with five minutes left.

The Big Red had four men scoring in double figures, with a sophomore, Steve Cram, leading with 19. The high man for Penn was Jeff Neuman, also a sophomore, with 15.

The lead changed hands seven times and the score was tied on 11 occasions in the first half. But 2½ minutes before the end
