

CORNELL DOWNS PENN FIVE, 76-65

Scores 26 Points in Last 10
Minutes of First Half

ITHACA, N. Y., Jan. 15—
Cornell scored 26 points in the
last 10 minutes of the first half
tonight for a 40-31 lead and
went on to beat Penn, 76-65.

Cornell couldn't score from
the floor for eight minutes in
the second half. Then baskets
by Blaine Aston, Garry Munson
and Steve Cram gave the Big
Red an insurmountable lead.

Cram led Cornell with 18
points while Dave Bliss, who
sparked the first-half drive, had
13 and Aston 12. Stan Pawlak
led Penn with 19 points.
