

Penn Routs Columbia

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 27—Stan Pawlak and Jeff Neuman spearheaded a late surge to-night and led Pennsylvania to a 71-58 victory over Columbia in an Ivy League game at the Palestra.

Pawlak scored 14 of his 27 points in the second half and became the second player in Quaker basketball history to score more than 500 points in a season. Pawlak has 517 points.

Neuman, putting on a stunning display of driving shots, notched 15 of his 23 points in the second 20-minute session.

Columbia's slowdown offense against the Penn zone kept the Lions in the lead for the 10-minute, but the Quakers rallied to gain a 29-28 lead at the half.

In second half the lead changed hands 10 times and the score was tied seven times before Neuman and Pawlak sent the Quaker into a commanding position.

Neuman put Penn in the lead to stay, 50-48, with a brilliant left-handed overhead layup with 7:30 remaining. From then on Columbia was kept in check.

Columbia finished the season with an over-all 7-15 won-lost record and a 5-9 mark in the Ivy League. Penn is 15-9 over all and 10-3 in the league.

Bill Melchionni hit for 31 points and Jim Washington made 17 as Villanova walloped Memphis State, 91-58, in the second game of a doubleheader.
