HANOVER, N. H., Jan. 7—

Stan Felsingner scored 40 points tonight and led Columbia to a 77-72 victory over Dartmouth in an Ivy League basketball game.

Scoring mostly on fallaway jump shots from the corner, the 6-foot senior from Brooklyn took charge of the Lion offense midway through the second half and scored 21 of his team's last 27 points. Dave Newmark, Columbia's 7-foot- $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch center, added 21 points and excelled on defense.

The Indians were led by Pete Dunlop with 25 points and Gunnar Malm with 17. Dartmouth held a 53-50 lead with 11:26 left in the game, but the combination of Felsingner and Newmark proved too strong.
