

Princeton Scores 4 Times, Then Holds Off Penn Rally to Gain 28-14 Victory

WEBER MAIN COG IN TIGERS' ATTACK

Hooks Up in Offensive Duel With Quakers' Creeden, Who Sets Passing Mark

PRINCETON, N. J., Oct. 28—Princeton rolled up four touchdowns in the first three quarters against Penn this afternoon, then held off a last-period rally by the Quakers, who scored two touchdowns and narrowly missed a third before they succumbed, 28 to 14. A crowd of 22,000 saw the game in cool, but sunny weather.

Two brilliant backs, Bob Weber of Princeton and Bill Creeden of Penn, shared the honors this afternoon as they carried on a sparkling offensive duel. Weber, who played only in the first half, scored two touchdowns and carried the ball 17 times for a total of 105 yards. He also completed one of three passes for 12 yards, giving him a total offensive pickup of 117 yards.

Creeden, who played the whole game for Penn, carried the ball 11 times, but was sheared so often for losses by the Princeton line that his net gain was only 4 yards. However, he scored both Penn touchdowns and completed 11 of 31 passes for 147 yards, giving him a total pickup of 151 yards. He broke an Ivy League record for the greatest number of pass attempts in a career. The former mark of 382, set by Archie Roberts of Columbia, has been displaced by 409 passes thrown by Creeden.

Tigers Dominate Game

For the first three quarters, the Tigers completely dominated the Red and Blue. A 20-yard punt return by Keith Mauney put them on the Pennsylvania 35-yard line late in the first period. They covered the remaining distance in nine plays, all but one on the ground. Weber carried or threw the ball on all but one of the plays, and made the touchdown on a plunge over right guard.

In the second period, a jarring tackle by Dick Sandler, a Princeton tackle, forced George Burrell to fumble deep in his own territory and Mauney recovered on the 4-yard line. The Quaker line proved very stubborn. But, on fourth down, Scott MacBean passed to Weber for the touchdown on the same play that scored a 2-point conversion that beat Rutgers.

Princeton opened the second half by marching 68 yards in nine plays for its third score, with Macbean, at tailback, and Ellis Moore, at fullback doing most of the ball carrying. Moore, a sophomore of whom much is expected, scored the touchdown on a 5-yard plunge over left guard.

Long Pass Backfires

On the following kickoff, Bob Monahan had trouble handling the high twisting ball and finally fell on it on the 8-yard line. Bill Creeden, passing from his own goal line, threw a long pass that was intercepted by Mauney, who ran diagonally across the field and scored standing up after a 25-yard romp. Garcia converted, as he had after the three previous scores.
