

Dowling Air Strikes Help Yale Vanquish Penn Eleven, 44-22

NEW HAVEN, Nov. 11—It would have been easy for Pennsylvania's football team to give up today as it fell behind to Yale, 14-0, before four minutes had elapsed.

But with Bernie Zbrzezny, a sophomore quarterback in his third varsity game, passing or running a total of 48 times, Penn moved back into the game only to lose, finally, by 44-22 to the Ivy League leaders.

The Bulldogs may still not know how to pronounce Zbreznj's name (Az-BREZ-nee) but they know what he can do.

He scored two touchdowns, was the game's leading ground-gainer with 92 yards in 16 car-

ries and completed 16 of 32 passes for 178 yards, including the third Penn touchdown.

If Coach Carmen Cozza had a worry before the game it was that his team would take Penn too lightly. After all, Yale demolished Dartmouth last week with one of the most powerful showings in its long football history. It entered the game with five straight victories, while Penn had only a 2-4 won-lost mark.

"If we win big," said Glenn Greenberg, a Yale tackle and the son of Hank Greenberg, the one-time baseball star, "people will say it's expected. And if we win by a few points, they'll say we're not so hot."

Yale didn't have to do much to jump to a quick lead. On the first play it recovered a fumble on the Penn 18-yard line, and five plays later Cal Hill ran across the goal line.

The next time Penn had the ball, it was forced to punt and John Brown's kick was blocked by Ed Franklin. Andy Coe caught the ball at the 29, received a three-man escort and charged over for another Yale score.

Quakers Close Gap

The Quakers closed the gap to 14-7 later in the period, but by the end of the half were trailing by 30-14 as Brian Dowling ripped their defense by completing 11 of 13 passes.

Often Zbrzenznj, replacing Bill Creeden, the Ivy's leading passer who was injured last week, looked like a man trying to find a place to hide in a hurricane as the big Yale line repeatedly chased him.

But early in the third quarter Zbrzenznj let his backs do the work and Penn went 78 yards to a touchdown. Normally, he doesn't hold the ball on the point-after attempts, but this time he did, and passed for 2 points, cutting the score to 30-22.

Both teams were forced to punt after that, but on the following series of plays, with thousands of fingers pointing to Penn's goal line, Lew Roney caught a pass from Dowling in the end zone and Yale was comfortably in front.

The Yalies in the crowd of

31,740 at the Bowl still weren't satisfied, however, and the home team added a touchdown in the final quarter that put Yale on the scoreboard for the 15th consecutive period.

Once again Yale's diversity was a major factor in the victory. Dowling's favorite receiver was Bruce Weinstein, a graduate of White Plains, (N.Y.) High, who grabbed five passes for 60 yards.

The quarterback also had Lew Roney, who scored his first two varsity touchdowns on passes, and Del Marting, who ran for 43 yards on three catches.

The teams were almost equal statistically, but Zbrzenznj had fewer options. His backfield mates, Cabot Knowlton and Gerry Santini, did some excellent running, but often the Penn quarterback was reduced to carrying the load himself. On one series he passed or ran on 11 straight plays.
