

PRINCETON DOWNS DARTMOUTH, 73-64

Alert Defense Plays a Key Role in Ivy Victory

PRINCETON, N. J., Jan. 10—Flawless foul shooting in the final minutes and a defense that made repeated steals and forced errors gave Princeton a 73-64 victory over Dartmouth tonight in a seesaw contest.

With the Indians leading 58-56, and nine minutes left, Jeff Petrie of Princeton scored, then John Arbogast, a substitute guard, made the first of his seven straight free throws to put the Tigers ahead.

Petrie was high scorer with 22 points. The Tigers evened their Ivy record at 2-2 while Dartmouth dropped to 1-2.
