Seminoles Tie Up Gilmore and Beat Jacksonville

TALLAHASSEE, Fla., Jan. 27 (AP) — Florida State's defense tied up the 7-foot-2-inch Artis Gilmore when it counted tonight and the Seminoles upset Jacksonville, 89-83.

Florida State ran its won-lost record to 15-2 and made a strong bid for the top 10 by booting the Dolphins from the undefeated ranks. Jacksonville had scored 13 victories.
