

Penn Earns Ivy Title Tie;

Brown 23d Victim, 96-82

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 26—
Undeclared Pennsylvania posted a 96-82 triumph over Brown in the Palestra tonight for its 23d victory of the season. Penn and Marquette are the nation's remaining unbeaten major college basketball teams.

The victory was Penn's 11th in the Ivy League and clinched at least a tie for the title. It also moved the Red and Blue closer to a berth in the National Collegiate tournament. Penn can capture the Ivy title against Yale here tomorrow night.

Hank Siemiontkowski's basket in the last second enabled Villanova to beat Temple, 67-65, in the second game of the double-header. Siemiontkowski was the game's high scorer with 20 points as the Wildcats raised their won-lost record to 22-6. Temple is 13-12.

Everybody played for Penn and 11 of the 14 scored. Steve Bilsky, the team's little man at 5 feet 11 inches, was the high scorer with 16 points. Dave Wohl, who missed his first six shots, had 15.

Arnie Berman, Brown's top scorer, made 24 points. It was the 12th defeat in 21 games for the Bruins.

Quakers Shoot 55%

The winners were faster, but not taller, and their Corky Calhoun helped to control both backboards. The shooting percentage of 55.3 was the best of the season for Penn, whose reserves helped by hitting their shots in the final minutes.

Penn led by 16 points at the half in registering a routine victory. The Quakers beat Brown last month, also by 14 points. Brown failed to move the ball and took poor shots, making 43 per cent of them.

The 23 victories set a Penn
