## PENN TURNS BACK LEHIGH BY 28-14

Quakers Register 52d in Row  
in Series With Engineers

PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 25 (UPI)—Ron Dawson, a junior halfback who left the team on his own volition after three games last season, staged a personal comeback today and scored two touchdowns as Penn opened its 95th football season with a 28-14 victory over previously undefeated Lehigh.

It marked the Penn coaching debut of Harry Gamble, who came to the Quakers from Lafayette. It was another disappointment for the Engineers, who haven't beaten Penn since 1899. It was Penn's 52d straight victory in the series.

Dawson, a 6-foot-1-inch, 190-pounder from Burlington, N. J., who simply dropped himself from the Penn squad last year on the grounds he wasn't ready for football, scored on touchdown smashes of 1 and 2 yards in the first and second quarters and each broke a tie and kept Penn on the victory route. Dawson sat out the final quarter.

The Engineers had scored first in the opening quarter on a 1-yard drive by Don Diorio, who capped a 51-yard march set up by a 21-yard interception return by Mark Matravich. The drive was kept alive with an 11-yard scamper by Mark McQuilken, a sophomore quarterback, and a 21-yard sprint by Jack Rizzo.

Penn rallied under the drive of Tom Pinto, a sophomore quarterback from Salem, Mass., who tossed a 50-yard pass to Don Clune to tie the score three minutes later. Then the Quakers went ahead on Dawson's 1-yard score, capping a 35-yard drive set up by a 24-yard return by Steve Solow.
