## PENN VANQUISHES LEHIGH BY 30 TO 27

Field Goal Decides—214
Yards for Bellizearo

BETHLEHEM, Pa., Oct. 21—Adolph Bellizeare, a sophomore halfback, equaled a University of Pennsylvania one-game rushing mark today as he led the Quakers to a 30-27 victory over

Lehigh.

Bellizeare carried the ball 34 times for 214 yards and two touchdowns. Penn, winning for the second time against two losses, had to overcome deficits of 13-0 and 27-23. Lehigh, on the passing of Kim McQuilken, matched the Quakers in touchdowns, each team collecting four.

Tim Martin's 27-yard field goal in the third quarter provided the winning margin.

McQuilken completed 22 of 37 passes for 249 yards and two touchdowns, keeping the Engineers in the game against Bellizeare's sprinting.

Bellizeare's 214 yards matched a total registered by Reds Bagnell against Dartmouth in 1950. Penn's total of 29 first downs was a Quaker record, topping the 26 made against Cornell in 1969.

Penn, trailing 27-23 late in the third period, marched 65 yards for the winning touchdown, which came early in the fourth period. Bob Hoffman's 15-yard gain sparked the drive and Bellizeare kept it moving with several key runs.

With the ball at the Lehigh 11, and fourth down, Mandel passed 10 yards to Bellizeare

and three plays later Mandel sneaked across for the winning touchdown.

Lehigh attempted a last-ditch march in the final minutes, moving from its 27 to midfield where Ken Bald's pass interception ended McQuilken's last hopes of a successful counterattack.

The Quakers, trailing 20-13 as the third quarter began, pulled even on a 66-yard march following the second-half kick-off. Bellizeare and Mandel provided most of the yardage on the ground, with Bellizeare scoring on a dive through left tackle.

Moments later the Quakers recovered a fumble at the Lehigh 34 and marched to field-goal range with Martin kicking a 27-yarder for a 23-20 advantage.

The Quakers rolled up 394 vards on the ground and 69 through the air. Lehigh made 249 passing and 71 rushing. It was the Engineers' fourth loss against three victories.
