

# ST. JOHN'S WINS ITS 11TH IN ROW

## Ends Villanova's Six-Year Streak on Campus With an 87-77 Triumph

VILLANOVA, Pa., Jan. 30 —

St. John's basketball team ended Villanova's six-year winning streak in the Wildcats' fieldhouse with an 87-77 triumph tonight before a capacity crowd of 3,500. It was St. John's 11th victory in a row, running this year's won-lost record to 14 and 2.

The Redmen won at Villanova, 59-52, in January, 1967, the Wildcats' last loss on campus. Villanova plays only five or six games a year on campus. Many of its home games are scheduled at the Palestra.

St. John's broke away to a 12-point lead in the first seven minutes. Ahead by 46-32 at half-time, St. John's pulled away to an 18-point lead. Villanova's flurries could not cut the margin below 6. Billy Schaeffer was high scorer for the Redmen with 22 points, followed by Ed Searcy with 19 points. Searcy had 16 rebounds.
