

# PENN FIVE TAKES IVY TITLE AGAIN

## 21-Point Streak Helps Rout Dartmouth by 74-46

PHILADELPHIA, March 3 — Pennsylvania won the Ivy League basketball championship for the fourth year in a row, clinching the title tonight with its easiest league victory of the season—a 74-46 rout of Dartmouth in the final game of the regular season.

The Quakers move on to the National Collegiate Athletic Association tournament and meet St. John's in the first-round of the East Regional March 10 at William and Mary.

Frank Mulzoff, coach of St. John's, hurried to the Palestra after his team lost a 93-90 thriller to Providence in New York this afternoon.

Just as he sat down to scout his opponent, Penn went on a rampage and scored the last 21 points of the first half to lead at intermission, 35-14.

Mulzoff said, "I can't learn anything with this game. I should have stayed home."

Penn's starters sat out the last six minutes of the game.

Penn is the first team to win the Ivy title four straight seasons since the league was formalized in 1955. This became the fourth straight Quaker team to win 20 games in a season as the Red and Blue finished with a 20-5 over-all won-lost mark, 12-2 in the league.

Penn also finished the season as the nation's No. 1 defensive team. The Quakers gave up an average of 55.6 points a game.

### Kid From Brooklyn

Penn entered the contest just a game ahead of Princeton. By the time the game was 14 minutes old, there was no doubt that Penn did not have to worry about Princeton tonight.

With the game tied at 14-14, Penn went on its 21-point streak. Ron Haigler, a sophomore from Brooklyn's Madison High School, got 10 of those points and finished with 16 to lead the Penn scorers.

During Penn's spree, Dartmouth had possession of the ball 19 times, but failed to score during the last 8 minutes 59 seconds of the first half.

Haigler opened the second half with a basket from the left corner so the Quakers actually had a run of 23 straight points. Late in the half, the Quakers had two stretches of 6 points in a row and another of 10. Dartmouth just wasn't in the game.

With 7½ minutes to go, Phil Hankinson of Penn twisted his left ankle and had to leave the game. The senior star received a long ovation and he concluded his final action on Penn's home court. He had 12 points.

After the game, Coach Chuck Daly said, "Oh, he just hurt it a bit. He'll be fine for next week against St. John's. No worry there."
