CLEMSON, S.C., Nov. 30 (UPI)—St. John's built a 16-point half-time lead and held on to defeat Jacksonville, 69-64, tonight in the opening college basketball game for both teams.

The Redmen took an early lead behind the shooting of Frank Alagia, who wound up with 17 points. Jacksonville rallied in the second half to tie the game at 56-56.

However, Alagia and Kevin Cluess gave St. John's a 62-56 lead and the Dolphins never got closer than 4 points.

Mel Utley also had 17 points for the Redmen.
