

Notre Dame Vanquishes Marquette

SOUTH BEND, Ind. Jan. 29 (AP)—John Shumate scored 27 points and Bill Paterno got 14 tonight, leading third-ranked Notre Dame to a 69-63 victory over No. 5 Marquette.

Shumate sank 11 of 14 shots from the floor. But it was Paterno's long bombs that took the Warriors out of their defensive patterns and provided the spark for the Irish offense.

Penn Tops Princeton

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 29 (AP)—Bob Bigelow sank a 20-foot jumper with six seconds to play tonight as Pennsylvania retained its Ivy League basketball lead with a 67-65 victory over Princeton.

Penn, with a 12-4 over-all won-lost record and 4-0 in the league, trailed by 30-25 with two minutes to go in the first half and Princeton decided to slow down the pace. But the Tigers committed two straight turnovers and Penn pulled to within a point at half-time.

The Tigers tied the game at 59-59 on Andy Rimol's two free throws with 4:08 left, but Henry Johnson put in a hook shot and two free throws to give the Quakers a 4-point lead.

JACKSONVILLE, Fla., Jan. 29 (AP)—Marvin Barnes and Robert Cooper led ninth-ranked Providence tonight to a 106-90 victory over Jacksonville.

It was the first regular-season loss for the Dolphins on their home court since Providence beat them two years ago. It was Providence's 16th victory against 2 losses.

Hunter Sinks Lehman

Jim McGuire scored 20 points last night to lead Hunter College to a 71-62 Knickerbocker Conference triumph over Lehman College at the loser's gym in the Bronx.

St. Bonaventure Victor

VILLANOVA, Pa., Jan. 29 (AP)—Steve Hocker scored 8 points in a second overtime period tonight as St. Bonaventure beat Villanova, 66-64.

The losing Wildcats led, 56-47, with 3:17 left in regulation time, but the Bonnies scored 9 consecutive points and tied the game at 56-56 on a jump shot by Glen Price with 10 seconds left.
