

Indiana Wins 21st; Louisville Is Upset

BLOOMINGTON, Ind., Jan. 25 (AP)—Indiana, the nation's top-ranked college basketball team, toyed with its archrival, Purdue, for six minutes today, then overwhelmed the 20th-ranked Boilermakers, 104-71, led by Scott May, with 23 points, and Quinn Buckner, with 18.

The largest crowd ever to attend a basketball game in the state—17,823—saw the Hoosiers extend the nation's longest winning string to 21 games over two seasons.

Indiana, with won-lost records of 7-0 in the Big Ten and 18-0 overall this season, moved two games ahead of the second-place Boilermakers (5-2 and 10-5) in the Big Ten.

John Garrett of Purdue, who scored 18 points, fouled out with 10 minutes left in the game and Indiana holding a 25-point lead, 77-52. The Hoosiers continued to widen the lead to 34 points, 88-54, when Coach Bobby Knight cleared the bench.

PEORIA, Ill., Jan. 25 (AP)—Greg Smith scored 10 points in the final three minutes tonight as Bradley gave second-ranked Louisville its first defeat of the season, 65-59.

The triumph gave Bradley a 2-3 record in the Missouri Valley Conference and 9-6 over all. Louisville fell to 4-1 in the league and 13-1.

Bradley led, 50-41, with 12:26 left, but fell behind, 57-53, with only 4:31 remaining.

Smith's baskets put Bradley in control and Jim Caruthers converted two free throws to put the game out of reach.

No. Carolina Beats Terps

COLLEGE PARK, Md., Jan. 25 (AP)—Two pressure free throws by Mickey Bell with three seconds remaining clinched a 69-66, upset victory for 14th-ranked North Carolina over third-ranked Maryland in an Atlantic Coast Conference game today.

The Tar Heels, who took over the A.C.C. lead with a 4-1 record, stymied and befuddled the Terps over the final 12 minutes while playing out their four corner offense.

A basket by Mo Howard with 55 seconds left, pulled the Terps, now 13-3 (4-2 in

the A.C.C.) to 1 point back at 67-66. Phil Ford then missed on a one-on-one foul shot situation with 28 seconds to go. The Terps rebounded, but John Lucas failed from the floor in Maryland's final chance.

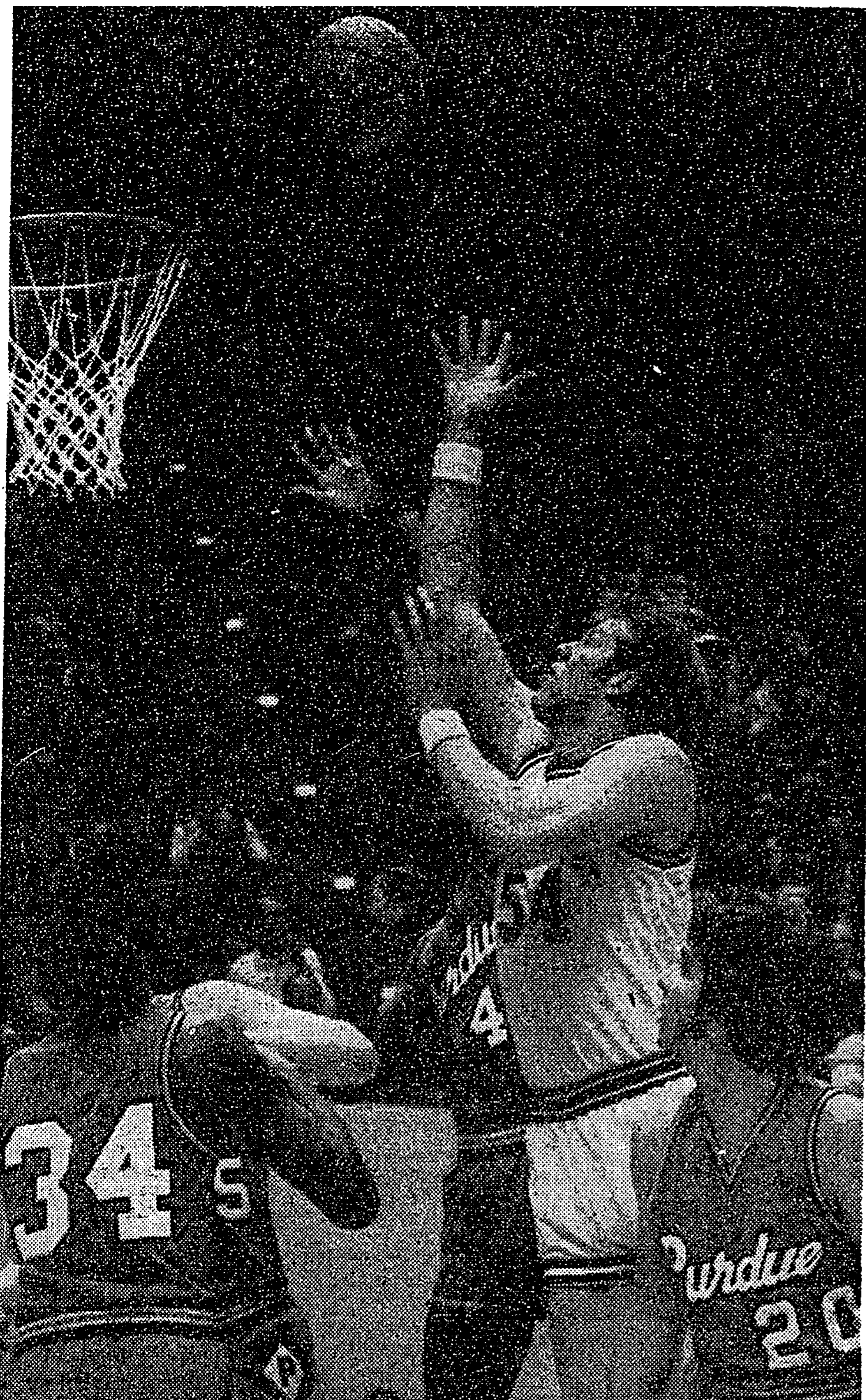
