

Dantley Injured, but Irish Rout Xavier of Ohio, 96-58

SOUTH BEND, Ind., Feb. 1 (AP)—Adrian Dantley, the nation's leading scorer, hit for a game high 23 points despite being injured with seven minutes remaining, as Notre Dame downed Xavier of Ohio, 96-58, today.

The Irish, now 11-6, jumped to an 8-0 lead and it was never close after that. Xavier lost for the ninth time in 16 games.

Dantley was forced to leave the game after colliding with an Xavier player while turning to drive for the basket. The Xavier player walked away, but Dantley, who was averaging 32.1 points a game going into the contest, had to be helped off the floor. It took seven stitches to close a cut over his right eye and X-rays were being taken of his nose.

Xavier was led by Gary Deidrick with 15 points.

Clemson Upsets Tar Heels

CLEMSON, S. C., Feb. 1 (AP)—For the second time in two weeks, Clemson upset one of the nation's top 10 teams tonight. The Tigers took the lead early and coasted to a 80-72 victory over North Carolina.

The victory, combined with Maryland's triumph over North Carolina State placed Clemson, North Carolina and Maryland in a three-way tie for first place in the Atlantic Coast Conference.

Rutgers Beats Navy

ANNAPOLIS, Md., Feb. 1 (AP)—Rutgers outscored Navy 17-0 in a six-minute span of the second half to rally for a 75-70 victory over the Midshipmen tonight. The victory was the 14th in 18 games for Rutgers. Navy stands 6-11.
