

Penn Trounces Cornell For 8th in Row, 83 to 64

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 8 (AP)—Ron Haigler scored 33 points in leading the University of Pennsylvania, the Ivy League's leader, to a 83-64 victory over Cornell tonight. It was the eighth victory in a row for Pennsylvania (16-4).

Joe Bryant and Bill Taylor powered a second half drive by La Salle that carried Explorers to a 74-63 victory over Temple in the second game of the double-header at the Palestra. Bryant had 26 points and 19 rebounds. Taylor scored 24 points for La Salle, now 5-0 in the East Coast Conference. The victory assured La Salle of at least a tie for the Philadelphia Big 5 championship.

Penn, now 7-1 in the league, put the game away early in the second half, outscoring Cornell, 14-4, in the first five minutes.

Haigler, a 6-foot, 8-inch senior from Brooklyn, moved into third place among Penn's all-time scoring leaders. In three seasons he has collected 1,394.

PRINCETON, N.J., Feb. 8—Princeton coasted to an 86-67 victory over Columbia tonight.

Barnes Hauptfuhrer, who scored 25 points, led Princeton, which widened a 34-24 half-time lead and put the game out of reach, 62-38 with 10 minutes 26 seconds left.

Princeton had taken a 17-2 lead eight minutes into the game on jumpers by Armond Hill and Tim van Blommestejn.

Columbia committed 20 turnovers and 21 fouls. Princeton shot 58 per cent from the field and outrebounded the Lions, 41-24.

Dartmouth Beats Yale

HANOVER, N.H., Feb. 8 (AP)—Jim Beattie scored 20 points and Bill Hooper came off the bench with two key baskets in the second half in leading Dartmouth to a 72-66 victory over Yale tonight.

The game was tied, 51-51, before baskets by Beattie and Hooper put Dartmouth ahead to stay for the last nine minutes of the game.

Brown Tops Harvard

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Feb. 8—Brown staved off a Harvard rally in the last minute tonight and escaped with a 77-76 Ivy League victory.

After Brown's Vaughn Clarke missed with 32 seconds remaining, Harvard worked for a final shot. The Crimson's Lou Silver was fouled with 0:04 left but missed his first shot on a 1-and-1 situation. Harvard took the rebound but failed to get off a shot before the buzzer.

Thompson Scores 35

CHARLOTTE, N. C., Feb. 8 (AP)—David Thompson, the national scoring leader, hit 35 points to lead sixth-ranked North Carolina State to a 102-87 victory over Furman tonight.

Thompson, who has scored 143 points in his last four games, is averaging 31.9 in the Wolfpack's 16-3 season. He hit 14 of 22 shots, 7 of 10 free throws, grabbed nine rebounds, had six steals and five assists.

F.D.U. Trounced

half tonight as the Hoyas (10-8) overwhelmed Fairleigh Dickinson University, 89-54. Thomas had 16 of his 18 points during that spurt. Rich Conrad led F.D.U. (7-11) with 19 points.

Queens Beats Hunter

Greg Vaughn scored a game-high 28 points, 15 in the second half, to lead Queens College to a 76-70 Knickerbocker Conference triumph over Hunter at the winner's court last night. It made Queens' conference record 5-0 and dropped Hunter to 4-1.

Kentucky Rolls, 75-61

LEXINGTON, Ky., Feb. 8 (AP)—Kevin Grevey and Mike Flynn sent Kentucky to a 12-2 early lead tonight and the Wildcats overpowered Georgia, 75-61, in a Southeastern Conference game. Grevey finished with 20 points and Flynn with 15 as fourth-ranked Kentucky won its 18th game against two loses.

Indiana Sets Back Iowa

IOWA CITY, Feb. 8 (AP)—Indiana's Scott May scored 23 points tonight and the top-rated Hoosiers rolled to a 79-56 Big Ten victory over Iowa and their 25th consecutive triumph over two seasons. Indiana, 11-0 in the conference and 22-0 over-all, had trouble with Iowa in the first 20 minutes and led, 39-31 at intermission.

Iowa, however, went cold early in the second half and Indiana scored eight straight points to take a 51-35 lead with 13:09 to play. Thereafter, Iowa never got closer than 14 points.
