

Maryland and Princeton Gain Tournament Final

COLLEGE PARK, Md., Dec. 29 (AP)—Armond Hill scored 20 points, leading Princeton to a 61-59 upset victory over eighth-ranked Alabama, and second-ranked Maryland trounced Seton Hall, 104-69, in the semifinals of the Maryland invitation basketball tournament tonight.

Unbeaten Maryland had an easy time in recording its eighth victory in the opener, John Lucas pacing the attack with 21 points.

Alabama, unbeaten in six previous games, trailed, 59-55, when Bob Slaughter, who scored 13 points for Princeton, sank two free throws with 38 seconds left for the winning margin.

Lucas scored 12 of his 21 points as Maryland opened a 24-9 lead early in the first half. Seton Hall trimmed a 17-point deficit to 35-27 before the Terps spurred for a 45-29 advantage at the intermission.

The Terps outscored the Pirates, 18-4, in the first four minutes of the second half.
