

Columbia Five Tops Yale, 70-57

NEW HAVEN, Jan. 30—Larry Collins of Columbia scored 18 points, his career high, tonight in leading the Lions to a 70-57 Ivy League basketball victory over Yale.

Collins was one of four players to score in double figures for the Lions, who have a 5-9 over all won-lost mark and are 3-0 in the Ivy League. Yale slipped to 3-14 and 1-2 in the league.

Columbia trailed most of the first half but scored 8 straight points in the final

three minutes to take a 30-27 halftime lead. Collins scored 4 points in that stretch. The Lions made 50 percent of their shots to 28 percent for the Elis.

Cornell 78, Brown 62

PROVIDENCE, R.I., Jan. 30 (AP)—Abby Lucas's 24 points paced Cornell tonight as the Big Red overwhelmed Brown, 78-62, in an Ivy League game.

Cornell started out with a 5-0 lead and stretched it to 29-16 with six minutes to go

in the first half. The Bruins struggled back to a 6-point deficit in the second period, but could get no closer.

Brian Saunders led the Bruins and all scorers with 26 points.

Pitt 67, Penn 60

PITTSBURGH, Jan. 30 (AP)—Larry Harris scored 32 points and the University of Pittsburgh survived some weak foul shooting to defeat Penn, 67-60, tonight in the second game of a double-header.
