

Princeton 70, Brown 52

PROVIDENCE, R.I., Feb. 5 (AP) — Princeton, led by Frank Sowinski, broke away from a 25-25 tie by hitting on its first 10 floor shots in the second half tonight in rolling to a 70-52 Ivy League victory over Brown.

Princeton, 13-5 overall and 5-1 in the league, held Brown's league scoring leader, Brian Saunders, to 8 points.

Sowinski, the nation's leader in field-goal shooting percentage, hit on 11 of 15 floor shots, finishing with 26 points. Overall, Princeton connected on 28 of 47 field-goal attempts, shooting 80 per cent in the second half.

Cornell 76, Dartmouth 45

ITHACA, N. Y., Feb. 5 (AP)—Bernard Vaughan scored 18 points and led Cornell to its most lopsided victory in 10 seasons tonight in a 76-45 victory over Dartmouth.

Cornell blew the game open when it outscored Dartmouth, 11-0, midway through the second half to make the score 58-30. The last time Cornell won by a bigger margin was in 1966-67 when it defeated Harvard, 96-62.

Penn 77, Yale 74

(Double Overtime)

NEW HAVEN, Feb. 5 (AP)—Bobby Willis scored 24 points and Kevin McDonald added 23 tonight as Pennsylvania defeated Yale in double overtime, 77-74.

Penn, 10-7 overall and 5-1 in the Ivy League, trailed the underdog Elis, 71-68, when McDonald went to work in the second overtime period. He hit two short jumpers, which were followed by a pair of free throws by Willis that gave Penn a 74-71 lead. Yale, which had led by 6 points during the first overtime period, lost its 10th straight and 14th in 17 games. The Elis are 1-4 in the league.
