

Brown Upsets Columbia Five

PROVIDENCE, R.I., Feb. 18 (AP)—Brian Saunders scored a career-high 39 points tonight and Brown snapped a six-game losing streak with a 91-83 Ivy League basketball upset of Columbia.

Saunders hit on 16 of 22 field-goal attempts and 7 of 9 free throws. He was helped by Chuck Mack with 16 points and Rob Crichton with 10.

Brown went in front for good after 7½ minutes and led, 49-39, at halftime. The Bruins built the lead to as many as 15 points, 69-54, en route to improving their record to 4-17, including 3-6 in the league.

With high-scoring Juan Mitchell sidelined with a twisted ankle, Columbia was led by Mike Wilhite with 23 points, Ricky Free with 19 and Alton Byrd with 16. The Lions' record slipped to 14-7, including 6-3 in the Ivy League.

Penn 81, Harvard 62

CAMBRIDGE, Mass., Feb. 18 (AP)—Keven McDonald, returning after missing a game last weekend, scored 28 points tonight in leading Penn to an 81-62 victory over Harvard.

McDonald scored 13 points in the first half as the Quakers opened a 36-23 lead, then scored Penn's first 7 points in the second half.

Penn improved its record to 13-7, including 8-1 in the Ivy League. Harvard is 5-14 overall and 2-6 in the league.

Princeton 65, Dartmouth 45

HANOVER, N.H., Feb. 18 (AP)—Princeton took an early lead, capitalized on hitting 33 of 45 foul shots, and coasted to a 65-45 victory tonight over Dartmouth.

Frank Sowinski led Princeton with 26 points as the Tigers jumped to a 26-16 halftime lead and expanded that to 44-24 with nine minutes to play.

The triumph gave Princeton a 16-4 record overall and 8-1 in the Ivy League. Dartmouth has a 2-17 record and is 2-6 in the league.

Yale 67, Cornell 64

NEW HAVEN, Feb. 18 (AP)—Two Sophomores, Dick Shea and Jim Yent, hit a pair of free throws each in the last 17 seconds tonight as Yale posted a 67-64 victory over Cornell.
