

Penn Victor As McDonald Leads Attack

PHILADELPHIA, Jan. 6 (AP)—Kevin McDonald scored 30 points to lead the University of Pennsylvania to an 86-81 Ivy League victory over Harvard in college basketball tonight.

In the second game of the double-header, a 30-point, 16-rebound effort from Michael Brooks sparked La Salle to a 116-97 triumph over Niagara. Brooks, a 6-7 sophomore, tallied 20 points in the first half and Kurt Kanaskie added 17 more as the Explorers took a 55-42 lead at intermission.

The Quakers, now 5-3, had a 39-22 lead on Tim Smith's jumper with 4:59 left in the first half, but Harvard, 3-8, battled back behind the play of Glenn Fine and Gary Ackerman to close to within 43-37 at halftime.

Tony Price sparked Penn in the second half, scoring 17 points, and the Quakers held a 76-61 lead with 6:36 to go when Harvard outscored Penn 12-2 to close the gap. But 4 points each by McDonald and Stan Green insured the victory.

City College 96, Staten Island 74

Richie Silvera and Joe Holman combined for 50 points in leading City College to a 96-74 victory over Staten Island College last night at Nat Holman Gymnasium. The victory was the fourth for City in conference play. Staten Island has lost all of its conference games.

The victory was the Beavers fifth in their last six starts. Silvera scored 26 points, 17 in the second half. Holman, the leading scorer in the conference, had 24 points and a record 14 assists.

The Beavers shot 24 of 34 from the floor in the second half. Steve Phillips led Staten Island with 22 points.

Princeton 60, Dartmouth 47

PRINCETON, N. J., Jan. 6 (AP)—Tom Young, a Princeton substitute center, came off the bench to score 16 points as the Tigers defeated Dartmouth, 60-47, at Jadwin Gym here tonight.

The Big Green, last year's cellar dwellers in the Ivy League, led the Tigers, last year's Ivy champs, for the first part of the opening half.

With 11:29 left in the period, Frank Sowinski, a forward, scored a layup after a steal to put Princeton ahead, 12-11; the Tigers never lost the lead.

Sowinski was high scorer with 17 points while the Dartmouth center, Sterling Edmonds, had 16. Princeton now is 5-7, 1-1 in the league. Dartmouth is 0-7, with two losses in the league.

St. Francis 84, Connecticut 81

STORRS, Conn., Jan. 6—Gerard Trapp hit four of five free throws in the last minute and a half tonight to give St. Francis College an 84-81 victory over the University of Connecticut. Trapp scored 24 points on 9-for-19 shooting from the floor and six of seven free throws to lead St. Francis to its fifth victory against three losses.

Alex Vega, starting in his first game for the Terriers, also hit 24 points on 11-for-15 field-goal shooting. Jeff Carr led the UConns with 24 points. The Terriers led by 38-37 at halftime.

Lafayette 65, Army 62

EASTON, Pa., Jan. 6 (AP)—Mike Bellamy, a guard, scored four foul shots in the closing 20 seconds to boost Lafayette to a 65-62 victory over Army tonight. The Cadets' Gary Winton hit nine of 10 field-goal attempts for a game-high 22 points and his teammate, Matt Brown, followed with 19.

Holy Cross 100, Fordham 65

WORCESTER, Mass., Jan. 6 (AP)—Ronnie Perry, a sophomore, tallied 26 points while hitting all 10 of his foul shots as Holy Cross routed Fordham, 100-65, tonight. The Crusaders delivered a 59-point second half for their eighth triumph in nine games. Fordham is now 4-8.

Providence 68, Brown 52

PROVIDENCE, Jan. 6 (AP)—A 25-point performance by Dwight Williams led Providence past Brown, 68-52, last night. The Friars broke open the game with a 12-4 tear midway through the second half.
